Osage Heritage Linear Park on USACE leased property. Three parks in one. With the completion of the trail system and the Harrison Street improvements, the waterfront is now connected to the downtown. The City is now ready to take the next step of connecting all of the downtown waterfront to the entire community. This is a critical step of implementing the Complete Street access to the entire community.

The following maps illustrate how all of the city parks are connected with the six miles of trail network. This in the truest sense a multimodal transportation route from the community.




The following pictures show the diversity of use within the Osage Heritage Linear Park. This park connects to the downtown and a completed Main Street Phase II will extend access it into the community.

Downtown connects to Drake Harbor Recreation Area

The revitalized downtown is now an active place for residents and visitors. It connects to Drake Harbor through the improvements on Harrison Street, which in turn, connects to the waterfront.

These improvements will continue with the above roadway and intersection at Harrison Street being totally rebuilt in the fall of 2016. The bike lane as shown above will mirror to the other side of the road providing complete bike access to the down.

Bledsoe Ferry Trail

Bledsoe Ferry Sports Complex is connected to the trail network by the Bledsoe Ferry Trail. Bledsoe Ferry Trail is on the USACE levy at the Joe Dice Suspension Bridge. The picture just below on the right side shows the bridge at the point connects to the trail. The following picture shows where the former Highway 7 roadbed was turned into the multi use path as it connects to the Bledsoe Ferry Trail.



Bledsoe Ferry Sports Complex

The complex has been improved over the last two years with the addition of a 1- softball fields and 2- T-ball fields. This is now a total of 5 ball fields and 2 soccer fields. It has become an ideal sports facility for county residents, traveling teams and tournaments. Its scenic location below Truman Dam, plus next to Lake of the Ozarks, provides an excellent location for sport events.





Lay Park
